Goals for next academic year:

- Provide further, clarifying updates for the Faculty Handbook on the Honor Code.
- Recruit / attempt to secure a minimum of one (1) faculty member from each Academic Department to enhance the membership of the Honor Code Board (who also serve as “Honor Code Hearing Officers”) and Student Conduct Board.
- Continuing to encourage reporting. Reporting varies from year to year. Students and faculty members report many circumstances in which violations are not reported. This is a University policy (and Tennessee administrative law) if any grade change or impact occurs. Moreover, it impacts recidivism.
- Continue offering “Ethics and Integrity Days” programming, which actively reminds and educates students on those topics.
- Continue offering the “Ethics and Integrity Course” for new incoming freshman, transfer, and graduate students prior to their first semester of enrollment.
