Each student will be advised on what general education credits they need by the Gateway Advisor after receiving acceptance to UTC as an undergraduate transfer student, and having submitted transcripts for evaluation. Admission to the university, graduation from an accredited diploma or associate degree nursing program, a current RN license, currently practicing as RN, and a minimum GPA of 2.0 meets the requirements for admission to the RN-BSN concentration.
