# Faculty Survey (Dec 20 /Jan 21)

#### **Executive Summary**

Spring 2021

- The majority of faculty (55%) who will teach face-to-face classes this spring do not feel safe returning to the classroom in current COVID-19 conditions (late December).
- Even fewer faculty (82.5%) who will teach face-to-face classes this spring would feel safe returning to the classroom if COVID-19 conditions worsen.
- The majority of faculty (68.3%) who will teach face-to-face classes this spring would feel safe returning to the classroom if COVID-19 conditions where similar to those experienced in August 2020.

Fall 2021

- The majority of faculty (77.9%) would feel safe returning to the classroom in the fall if faculty, staff, and students are vaccinated.
- Less than half of faculty (41.8%) would feel safe returning to the classroom in the fall if they were vaccinated, but other faculty, staff, and students were not required to be vaccinated.
- Less than a fifth of faculty (17.9%) would feel safe returning to the classroom in the fall if they were not vaccinated.
- The majority of faculty (63.9%) support continuing to require face masks on campus in Fall 2021.
- The majority of faculty (62.4%) support continuing to require social distancing on campus in Fall 2021.
- The majority of faculty (59.4%) support continuing reduced class sizes in Fall 2021.
