- 2) Voting on Minutes Theresa Blackman votes to approve, Eunice Davis seconded
- 3) Reimagining General Education- Dr. Lauren Ingraham shared reimaging gen ed website (https://www.utc.edu/academic-affairs/general-education/rge) Writing and Communication requirement has changed to accommodate for student testing into 1020 to have additional study in writing. Lower Quantitative reasoning requirement to be in line with other TBR schools. Natural Sciences reduced to 3-4 hours, emphasis on creating sciences for non-science disciplines. Broadening the Humanities to be more inclusive and less restrictive, will be only 9 hours, more flexible outcomes. New categories: Diversity Equity and Inclusion, Gen Ed Elective, Chattanooga Based Project. Currently deciding whether DEI will be its own category, or a quality applied to other categories. Dr Ingraham went over some more detail of the website FAQs. Amanda Chambers asked about how this will impact transfer students, example Chattanooga State students. Marketing our gen ed options, example Chattanooga Project, as a "signature opportunity" for anyone coming in without a completed Associates. Scott Dayton asked how this was communicated to department heads to make sure courses will be more flexible for accepting classes from other institutions. The goal is to make this more flexible by have fewer outcomes so that related courses can truly be accepted. Erica Holmes Trujillo asked if we would be offering more of the options per semester rather than having a list where not all of the options are available. We need to work on how to make more regularly offered courses more attractive for students.
- 4) **Counselor Education Masters program-** Dr. Elizabeth O'Brien: Two concentrations School Counseling and Clinical Mental Health. Similar to but not the same as MSW. Both make

students certification and licensure eligible. Need to apply to Graduate school and to the program specifically. Brochures available. Email Elizabeth-obrien@utc.edu
