

UNIQUE LEAD PRINCIPAL INVESTIGATORS






Dr. Li Yang, professor of computer science and director of the **National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense**, exemplifies the deep interconnection between meritorious research and student learning. While at UTC, Dr. Yang has attracted more than **\$1.5** million in sponsored program awards. Her expertise in cybersecurity and innovations in using artificial intelligence to assess software and cybersecurity protocols have attracted funding from a number of sponsors. Notably, Dr. Yang has invested her considerable talents in

pursuing her research and in building UTC's capacity to prepare students for the cybersecurity workforce of the future. With her leadership, UTC has attracted scholarship funds to recruit, retain and diversify students pursuing computer science and cybersecurity careers. Dr. Yang also attracted funding to establish the National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense. Dr. Yang's expertise is nationally recognized, and her successful research career has earned her an appointment as a program officer at the National Science Foundation.








FIVE-YEAR TREND - PROPOSALS









His eight projects have the potential to bring in more than **\$816k** to support a variety of initiatives surrounding disaster management, opiate and pathogen detection and leukemia therapy, to name a few.




Dr. Hunter Huckabay, attracted more than \$5.1 million for the Center for Community Career Education for the multi-year **GEAR UP** project. This project empowers low-income, potential first-generation students to succeed in school and prepare for college.

Dr. Amber Roache led the School of Nursing in proposals by requesting and receiving more than \$699k for the **Clinical-Academic Network for Developing Leaders.** The excellent work of Dr. Roache and the project team was vital in attracting a \$137k supplement to address pain management and the opioid crisis.





Dr. Hemant Jain, professor of management, has been the **top recipient of awards** across the College of Business for several years running. Dr. Jain's initiatives focus on supporting graduate student research examining the predictors of college success.

Under the direction of **Libby Santin**, the **Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE)** was established in 2018 to "inspire, nurture and empower scholarship, creativity, discovery, innovation and entrepreneurial initiatives." In FY2019, the CIE played a key role in an Economic Development Administration Regional Innovation Strategies proposal in collaboration with the



Company Lab and UTC's CUIP. The CIE is positioned to connect UTC's research potential with economic development through the Co.Starters Cohort for Research program and other initiatives.
