

## Admission Requirements

To apply to the Rollins Scholars program, you must be an incoming freshman and begin classes in the fall semester. You must be admitted to UTC and declare business as your major on your application.

Admission to this program is competitive and decisions are based on a variety of factors such as:

- Extracurricular involvement
- Leadership activity
- Two letters of recommendation
- A Zoom interview
- An essay or video submission
- A well-organized resume
- Work experience

## Application and Interview Dates

Applications are available online Sept. 25, 2020 and are due by Dec. 1, 2020. Interviews will be scheduled in January of 2021.

## A Four-Year Program


Once selected for this prestigious program, Rollins Scholars will continue to participate in the program and receive scholarship support of \$4,000 per year by meeting the following requirements:

## Our City is Our Classroom


